
## NOBEL SYMPOSIA

The NOBEL SYMPOSIUM NS 203 "African Youth Show the Way Towards Peace and Democracy, 6th IYTT Youth Conference" is funded by the Marcus and Amalia Wallenberg Foundation, organized by the International Youth Think Tank, and Stellenbosch University, in cooperation with The Norwegian Nobel Institute, and hosted at STIAS-Stellenbosch Institute for Advanced Study. The NOBEL SYMPOSIA mark is owned by the Nobel Foundation.

#### **PROGRAMME**

When too many people are unheard or excluded from decision-making, and authoritarian regimes work to cynically manipulate and roll back democratic processes, young minds are indispensable. The 6th IYTT Youth Conference & NOBEL SYMPOSIUM NS 203 engages 24 participants in the 18-to-28-age-span selected from 195 applications to an open call. Building on a dynamic interplay between the 24 participants, and distinguished speakers and commentators the overall goal is to inspire people and innovate democracy for a brighter future. The 24 participants choose themes, discuss how to understand the ideal of democracy, and produce a dozen proposals for democratization, democracy renewal and peace keeping, delivered in a concluding presentation and report. Besides providing explorative ideas to research, the results will be published in the *IYTT Handbook for Innovative Democracy* to inspire leaders in civil society, industry, and politics.

The 24 participants will leave the conference trained in democracy entrepreneurship, with broadened knowledge, strengthened voices, enhanced network capacities, and new friends.

As indicated on the programme, some sessions are open to the public and live streamed whereas the remaining sessions are only for the 24 participants and engaged inspirational speakers and commentators.
